The Regular Meeting of the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority was held on Wednesday, April 18, 2012 in the Authority Office with the following Commissioners present:

Mr. Eddie Campbell, Jr.; Mr. James H. Gray; Mr. Dennis W. Reiter, and Mr. Christopher Walker.

Others attending were Mr. L. Russell Trice, PE of Richard A. Alaimo Assoc., Consulting Engineers, Mr. Michael A. Armstrong, Solicitor; Mr. Timothy Kiel, CPA of Bowman & Co., Independent Auditors; Mr. Joseph S. Bateman, Executive Director; Mr. James Mackie, Director of Operations, and Mr. Harry F. Killian, Secretary/Treasurer,

Chairman Gray called the meeting to order at 4:30 PM and instructed the Secretary to read the following statement:

Public notice of the meeting, pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, has been given by the Authority in the following manner:

A. Posting written notice on the official bulletin board of the Authority building on Wednesday, February 2, 2012.

B. Mailing written notice to the Municipal Clerks of Willingboro and Westampton Townships; the Secretary of the Edgewater Park Sewerage Authority and the Executive Director of the Mount Laurel Municipal Utilities Authority on February 2, 2012 by Certified Mail.

C. Publishing a Public Notice in the Burlington County Times and Courier-Post on February 4, 2012.

D. Directing the Secretary to enter into the minutes of this meeting this public announcement.

The Secretary advised Mr. Clemons and Ms. Jennings would not be in attendance; therefore, Mr. Walker will be the voting alternate.

Mr. Campbell moved and Mr. Walker seconded that the minutes of the Regular and Closed March Meetings be approved as printed and distributed.

The Treasurer's Report for March 2012 was received and filed on a motion made by Mr. Walker that was seconded by Mr. Campbell.

The Operations Report for March 2012 was received and filed as printed and distributed on a motion by Mr. Campbell that was seconded by Mr. Walker.

The Director of Operations reviewed the status of the Well #5 radioactivity in detail.

The Executive Director also discussed the public notification steps that were taken to be in compliance with New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection regulations.

Mr. Campbell and the other members complimented the Executive Director on the newspaper article and said that it was informative and yet provided a balance discussion of the situation.

After all discussion, the Chairman called for a vote of the members.

Chairman Gray then introduced Mr. Kiel to review the 2011 Audit.

Mr. Kiel said that based on an analysis of the past five years of operations, the Authority's financial health has remained very consistent and showed many positive trends. He said that we consider the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority one of the most fiscally sound water and sewer authorities that Bowman & Company audits.

He then listed the key strengths that he has seen over the past five years that contribute to this assessment:

- The Board and management have adopted budgets that have increased operating expenses by approximately 2% while other authorities have averaged 3-4%.
- The Board and management have effectively implemented rate increases that have paralleled the increases in operating expenses. This has resulted in the Authority's unrestricted net assets to remain consistent each year, at a level which is sufficient for the size of the Authority.
- Even with the economic downturn and rate increases, the Authority has been able to collect approximately 100% of their service fees. Other authorities in South Jersey have had significant drops in the percentage of collections.
- While the water department has operated with an unrestricted deficit for the past few years, the Authority has sufficient unrestricted net assets in the sewer department to cover three (3) months of operating, capital and debt service expenses for both the water and sewer departments without any revenue being received.
- Excluding Federal and State grants, in the past five (5) years the Authority has generated adequate net income that has all been reinvested into the Authority's infrastructure.
- The Authority has also invested about 13 million of borrowed money and 4.5 million of Federal Grant money into the water and sewer infrastructure.

- The Authority is in the process of hiring a contractor to complete an analysis of all underground infrastructure in order to allocate resources more efficiently to capital needs.
- There has only been one finding in the past five years. This finding was the result of a difference of opinion regarding an interpretation of local public contracts law as opposed to an oversight or failure to follow the law.

The only negative we see, if any, is that connection fees and investment income have had significant drops and these revenues cannot be relied upon in the near future. With the infrastructure improvements planned and the gradual inflation of operating expenses, additional revenues including a potential service fee rate increase will be needed to cover these costs, especially in the water department.

The Authority most likely does not have sufficient future revenues to cover these costs in 2013. We would like to note that Mr. Bateman has already begun the process of evaluating necessary rate adjustments for the next few years and plans to have the analysis completed in June 2012.

In summary, we feel that the Authority's financial heath is very strong and consistent. While we cannot give an opinion on the condition of the Authority's infrastructure, as noted above, the Authority has been investing heavily into it and has begun a detailed study of their future infrastructure needs.

Authority members asked several questions about the Audit that were satisfactorily answered.

Mr. Kiel said that his was a draft audit as they were awaiting Bond Counsel's opinion on New Jersey Clean Energy Fund. He said that the final audit would contain no difference in any of the figures.

He concluded by saying that the audit will be delivered to the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs in a timely manner and that the Authority will be able to certify the audit at the next regular meeting.

Chairman Gray thanked Mr. Kiel for his presentation and excused him from the balance of the meeting.

The Chairman asked for comments from the public.

The Secretary noted for the record that no members of the pubic were in attendance.

The Executive Director presented an update and registration materials for the Association of Environmental Authorities Conference on April 24th and 25th

The Executive then reviewed the status of awarding contracts for Concrete Repairs and Replacements.

He said that after consulting with the professionals he was prepared to introduce the following resolution for the members' consideration.

RESOLUTION 2012–21

REVISIONS TO RULES AND REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THE PAYMENT OF CONNECTION FEES

WHEREAS, The Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority (the "Authority") is a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey and in accordance with the Municipal and County Utilities Authorities Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:14B-1 <u>et seq.</u>, is authorized to implement and operate a municipal utilities authority; and

WHEREAS, the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority was created in 1958 at which time it developed a set of Rates, Rules and Regulations for the proper operation of the Authority, and

WHEREAS, the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority believes it to be in the best interest of the Authority and its customers that the Rates, Rules and Regulations be reviewed and updated to insure that they are in compliance with all applicable Laws, Statutes, and Regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority to amend its rules and regulations as follows:

I. The following sections of the Rules and Regulations shall be deleted and replaced in their entirety by those sections identified in Section II below.

A. Section II, Schedule of Rates; E., Schedule V - Water and/or Sewerage Connection
Fees, General Requirements Applicable to Water and Sewer Connection Fees; Page II-6,
Paragraph A.

B. Section II, Schedule of Rates; F, Schedule VI - Water and/or Sewer Application, Review and Inspection Fees; Page II-9, paragraph I and j.

C. Appendix E, Technical Specifications; Section II; General Specifications, paragraph 1.1
General Approval Requirements, Page E-5.

- II. The following paragraphs replace those sections:
- A. Section II, Schedule of Rates; E., Schedule V Water and Sewer Connection Fees,

General Requirements Applicable to Water and Sewer Connection Fees; Page II-5.

3. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

APPLICABLE TO WATER AND SEWER CONNECTION FEES

A. THE AUTHORITY requires that connection fees be paid before the Authority will endorse NJDEP Treatment Works Approval (TWA) and Bureau of Safe Drinking Water (BSDW) permit applications.

B. If connection fee rates increase between the time the APPLICANT/DEVELOPER initially pays the fee and the time of physical connection to the Authority's water or sewer systems, the APPLICANT/DEVELOPER is required to pay the difference between the rates previously paid and new connection fee rates in effect at the time of connection. If connection fee rates decrease the APPLICANT/DEVELOPER will receive a refund.

C. If the number of connections or the type of use changes from the time the connection fees are initially paid, either of which results in a change in the calculation of the connection fees and amounts due, the fees due will be recalculated using the rates currently in effect.

D. If a TWA, BSDW or other NJDEP permit is not required the connection fees must be paid prior to final approval by the Authority (consulting engineer). Recalculation of connection fees shall be in accordance with paragraphs B and C above.

The remaining paragraphs B - G shall become paragraphs E - J.

- B. Section II, Schedule of Rates; F, Schedule VI Water and/or Sewer Application, Review and Inspection Fees; Page II-9, paragraphs I and j.
 - h. To pay all fees as estimated by the Authority's Consulting Engineer on the basis of expected gallonage. Applicant will furnish Consulting Engineer with support data relative to type of use, construction, estimated water consumption, etc.
 - i. For any proposed connection where the tenant/use is not known upon completion of construction, the Applicant/Owner and/or prospective tenant must secure approval from the Authority before occupancy. This will enable the Authority to make the necessary adjustment in fees in accordance with Schedule V. The Applicant has a right to appeal to the Authority's Commissioners for a review of the Connection Charges. The Board may in its full discretion, authorize a use evaluation period of one to two (1-2) years, depending on the type of installation, at the end of which the charges may be adjusted, based on actual use. It should be noted that the charges may increase or decrease as a result of the Review.

III This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Mr. Reiter commented on the electrical energy savings and moved that the list of bills as presented be paid. Mr. Campbell seconded the motion.

Mr. L. Russell Trice, PE of Richard A. Alaimo, Assoc., Consulting Engineer, presented the Engineers Monthly Status Report as follows:

MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES

We have been working with the Authority on various issues related to the Gross Alpha violation at Well No. 5. We attempted to use the computerized model of the Authority's water system, which was developed in the early 1990's to determine if the Mount Laurel Township Municipal Utilities Authority (MLTMUA) received any water from Well No. 5. The software used at that time is obsolete and did not have the capability to provide the information needed. As a result, a new hydraulic model of the water system was constructed using current "state of the art" software. This software has the ability to estimate the percentage of water flowing through the interconnection from each of the Authority's supply sources. The estimates indicated that less than three percent (3%) of water from Well No. 5 reached the interconnection and that the range of gross alpha concentration at the interconnection could range from 0.31 pci/l to 1.96 pci/l. The NJDEP accepted these calculations and did not require the MLTMUA to issue a public notice.

SEWER MAIN CLEANING AND TELEVISING, PHASE III

The contract was awarded to New England Pipe Cleaning Company in the amount of \$74,200.00. Authority personnel are providing construction management and inspection services for this project.

DIGESTER SLUDGE TRANSFER PUMP

The pump has been running with no problem since the piping was cleaned and normal pumping operations resumed. Closeout paperwork remains to be completed.

SOLAR ELECTRIC GENERATING SYSTEM- WATER TREATMENT PLANT AND WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT

The Authority awarded this contract to APS Contracting Incorporated, in the amount of \$6,641,500.00. All work has been completed for the solar project at the WPCP. The new generator at the Main WTP was successfully started up and training was provided. Punch list items remain to be completed.

WINDSOR PARK INTERCEPTOR MAIN CLEANING AND LINING

Bids for this project were rejected at the Authority's January meeting because they were substantially higher than the budget estimate.

Flow recordings that were obtained from the Windsor Park pumping station indicate that actual flows are less than originally assumed. As a result, the bidders' bypass pumping costs should be lower.

Revised bid documents will be prepared which will require bidders to provide a price for a minimum scope of work with alternate bids which increase the scope and corresponding price. In this manner, the Authority will be able to award a contract in line with budgeted amounts. The proposed project schedule is to re-advertise the project, receive bids and award the project in the late spring/early summer.

WELL NO. 6 REDEVELOPMENT AND PUMP REPLACEMENT

The new well has been installed and is ready for operation. The last remaining item to complete is rebuilding the existing well pump motor.

WPCP SETTLING TANK REPAIR

Plans and specifications for the repair and painting of the concrete walls, floor slabs, etc., in one (1) settling tank at the WPCP have been completed and forwarded to the Authority for review.

SANITARY SEWER TELEVISING

A draft request for proposal for the sewer televising, software and data compilation services has been completed. Authority personnel, the solicitor and our office must review the draft RFP before it can be advertised.

The Chairman asked how long Well # 5 would be out of service and what do we do about the problem.

Mr. Trice said that he, the Executive Director and the Director of operations have had ongoing discussions about the matter. He continued that additional investigation would need to take place before a final recommendation could be made.

Mr. Gray said his concern was that the matter may not be handled expeditiously .

He was assured both by Mr. Trice and Mr. Bateman that there would be no delay in resolving the matter but that it was necessary to know what the resolution was in order to solve the problem.

It was moved by Mr. Reiter and seconded by Mr. Campbell to receive and file the Engineer's Monthly Status Report as presented.

The Executive Director gave an update on the Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation Assess Management Program as follows:

The bid documents and contract have been drafted and are ready for the staff's and solicitor's review.

Other sanitary sewer rehabilitation companies have been contacted in an effort to evaluate their products and develop more widespread interest by vendors in bidding.

The scope of the work has been modified to save money. Evaluation of such factors as depth, pipe size, physical condition of the main and number of homes served in order to quantify risk has been done. He said that as a result, we eliminated those sections that were judged to be "low risk". Low risks mains, he explained, are those backyard mains where there would-be minimal risk of sanitary sewer overflow and/or interruptions in service to large numbers of customers. He said that a majority of these mains would by repaired by the Authority's own crew if a collapse were to occur.

Mr. Bateman said that 100% of the most important, large diameter mains are included in this evaluation and that this reduction in scope will reduce the length of pipe to be evaluated by roughly one half.

He concluded by saying that this change in scope is estimated to save approximately \$300,000.

The Executive Director then requested that the Consulting Engineer be authorized to proceed to bid the sanitary sewer assessment program as well as tank coatings at the Pollution Control Plant and the re-bid of the Windsor Sere Pumping Station interceptor sliplining.

Mr. Reiter moved that the Consulting Engineer be so authorized. Mr. Campbell seconded the motion.

WHEREAS, Schedule VI of the Rates, Rules and Regulations of the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority requires that the owner of the property and/or his representative

making application for approval of any connection to the Authority Systems post a performance bond in the amount covering the cost of construction as estimated by the Authority's Consulting Engineer, and

WHEREAS, the Consulting Engineer may, from time to time, recommend the reduction of the performance bond upon the satisfactory completion of portions of the project, and

WHEREAS, the Consulting Engineer has recommended the reduction of the performance bond as permitted in NJSA 40:55D – 53e for the project identified as Willingboro Walk Phase 1 in the amounts specified:

WATER	\$79,906.29
SEWER	\$44,466.52

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority assembled in regular session this 18th day of April 2012 that:

1. The letter of credit for the Project described above be reduced in the aforementioned amount and payment of all outstanding fees

2. A copy of this resolution be forwarded to Weiss Properties Inc., Inc., as developer and owners of the above project.

3. A copy of this resolution be made a part of the minutes of this public meeting.

A motion was made by Mr. Gray and seconded by Mr. Reiter to approve the resolution as presented.
