This is a matter of concern because it has an impact upon the MUA's revenues. Mr. Killian suggested that we decrease could be accounted for by the decrease in the number of connected customers. Mr. Bateman stated that this fact was considered in the graph because the graph is based upon the average number of gallons consumed by the then current number of connections. There were several other questions by the Commissioners which were answered by Mr. Bateman.

The Executive Director discussed the continued sale of solar energy credits and asked that he be authorized to sell the renewable energy credits and to appoint Flett Exchange LLC as the broker.

The Chairman directed the Secretary to introduce the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2012 - 1

AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF SOLAR RENEWABLE ENERGY CREDITS AND APPOINTING A BROKER

WHEREAS, the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority owns and operates a photovoltaic generation system; and

WHEREAS, the Authority owns the exclusive rights to the solar renewable energy certificates created by the solar project; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Authority to sell renewable energy credits created by this solar generation system, and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has authorized the sale of SRECs through an online auction process as specified in the Local Unit Electronic Technology Pilot Program, P.L. 2001, c. 30; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has approved various vendors to conduct online auctions; and

WHEREAS, the Flett Exchange is one of those approved vendors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

- 1. The Executive Director is authorized to take all actions necessary to sell solar renewable energy credits for 2012.
- 2. The Flett Exchange is selected to act as the broker to effectuate this sale

SEWER MAIN CLEANING AND TELEVISING, PHASE III

The contract was awarded to New England Pipe Cleaning Company in the amount of \$74,200.00. Authority personnel are providing inspection services.

MICRO TURBINE FACILITY

The Authority awarded this contract to Municipal Maintenance Company, in the amount of \$925,100.00. All work has been completed. Since the contractor is required to provide operation and maintenance services for two (2) years, the contract will remain open until those services are completed.

DIGESTER SLUDGE TRANSFER PUMP

The new pump has been installed and all piping work has been completed. The existing clutch between the new pump and existing motor trips on torque overload and must be replaced. A quote from the contractor has been received in the amount of \$5,000 and a new clutch will be purchased.

SOLAR ELECTRIC GENERATING SYSTEM- WATER TREATMENT PLANT AND WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT

The Authority awarded this contract to APS Contracting Incorporated, in the amount of \$6,641,500.00

All work has been completed for the solar project at the WPCP and the contract can now be closed out. The generator has been delivered to the WTP and in place. Installation of the generator transfer switch and wiring work remain to be completed.

WINDSOR PARK INTERCEPTOR MAIN CLEANING AND LINING

Bids were received on January 11, 2012. Two (2) bids were received. Two bids were received as follows:

Reynolds In-liner, LLC \$643,525.00

AM-Liner-East, Inc. \$732,594.00

The low bid exceeds our estimate of \$269,000 by 139%. Therefore, we recommend that the bids be rejected. The bidders indicated that the costs associated with bypass pumping were very high and that they are currently very busy and their bids reflected a premium price since they consider the scope of work to be much more difficult than normally encountered. We will meet with Authority personnel to discuss ways to revise the scope of work and reduce the project cost.

WELL NO. 6 REDEVEOPMENT AND PUMP REPLACEMENT

A. C. Schultes was awarded the contract in the amount of \$77,250.00. The Contractor has removed the pump and performed the initial pumping test. Redevelopment of the well should begin shortly.

The Consulting Engineers' Report was received and filed on a motion by Mr. Reiter that was seconded by Mr. Gray.

The Consulting Engineer then discussed the proposal from RedZone and explained the program and the fact that their software is compatible with existing GSI software. He detailed other aspects of the innovative process.

Mr. Trice said that the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority can base future sanitary sewer repair or replacement budgets on the data received from RedZone.

He further explained the RedZone financing proposal to enter into a contract to extend the cost over a number of years at no interest. He also said there was no obligation on the Authority's part as RedZone will assume the risk.

Mr. Bateman said that other communities have legal opinions on the matter and this could be an opportunity to "get the best bang for the buck' when making future repairs.

The Chairman said that RedZone suggested a five (5) year pay back and that the contract proposal should be reviewed by the Solicitor.

The Treasurer suggested that the financing portion be reviewed by Bond Counsel to determine if at was necessary to go through the Local Finance Board.

Mr. Clemons said that he liked the technology. His thought is that we should be proactive and the assessment must be made and then ongoing.

- Mr. Gray asked if we owned the software after completion of the project.
- Mr. Trice said that we would be licensed to utilize the software.

The Board showed a great deal of interest in the program and directed the Engineer and the Solicitor to continue investigate and report back at the next meeting.

In the matter of the slip-lining of the Windsor Park Pump Station interceptor, he moved that the bids be rejected. Mr. Gray seconded the motion.

The Consulting Engineer then discussed the Maintenance Bond for the USHCP Renal Care project.

The Chairman instructed the Secretary to introduce the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2012 - 2 WAIVING THE MAINTENANCE BOND FOR US HEALTHCARE DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, Schedule VI of the Rates, Rules and Regulations of the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority requires that the owner of the property and/or his representative

making application for approval of any connection to the Authority Systems post a maintenance bond after satisfactory completion of construction, and

WHEREAS, the Consulting Engineer may, from time to time, recommend the waiver of a maintenance bond upon the satisfactory completion of portions of the project or when the water and sewer extension are to remain private, and

WHEREAS, the project was physically completed in the spring of 2005.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Willingboro Municipal Utilities Authority assembled in regular session this 17th day of January, 2012 that:

- 1. The requirement for a maintenance bond is hereby waived.
- 2. A copy of this resolution be forwarded to U. S. Healthcare Development, Inc. as developer and owners of the above project.
- 3. A copy of this resolution be made a part of the minutes of this public meeting. Mr. Clemons moved that the resolution be approved. Mr. Gray seconded the motion.

Chairman Campbell asked the Solicitor if there were any legal matters to be discussed. He said he had nothing at this time.

Mr. Scholtis, noting that this would be his last meeting as a Commissioner reviewed his activities in Willingboro Township over the pas twenty (20) years and aid that all of his involvement from Fun Day to the Local Welfare Board and the Authority along with other associations has been very rewarding.

Chairman Campbell said that the Township appreciates all the work that Mr. Scholtis has done over the years. He thanked him and said God bless you.

- Mr. Reiter said that as a personnel matter he was distributing information on the New Jersey pensions funding. He noted that the report indicates that at the current rate, the fund may be bankrupt by 2016.
- Mr. Gray asked when we will get finalization on RedZone. We need a turn around time from the solicitor. He said there can be no procrastination.
- Mr. Clemons expressed concern that if it necessary to go out to bid, the contract couldn't be awarded at the March meeting.

He also said that his has been an enjoyable year and he has learned a lot and looks forward to working with everybody in the upcoming year.

Chairman Campbell said that in regard to the performance of the Professionals, he

believed that the Executive Director should provide periodic reports to the Commissioners with

at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of each year.

Mr. Armstrong asked if the professionals will have an opportunity to respond. He

mentioned the RICE process.

Mr. Campbell noted that the RICE process only applies to public employees and that

the Solicitor was not an employee. He said that the professionals will certainly have to time

review the report.

Mr. Clemons said that every report doesn't have to be negative.

There being no other business to transact, the meeting was adjourned at 5:20 PM on a

motion made by Mr. Gray that was seconded by Mr. Reiter.
