He also spoke about what he believed to be obstructions and inaction by the Authority and of the unwillingness of the owner of Willingboro Walk to provide the necessary easements and sewer connection at a reasonable cost.

The Solicitor said that there has been a willingness of the Authority to work with the owner. He outlined conversations he has had with the owner's wife, who is an attorney as well as the attorney that is representing Mr. Elfar.

Mr. Armstrong detailed the many ways that the Township and the MUA have tried to assist Mr. Elfar.

SEWER MAIN CLEANING AND TELEVISING, PHASE III

The contract was awarded to New England Pipe Cleaning Company in the amount of \$74,200.00. Authority personnel are providing construction management and inspection services for this project.

SOLAR ELECTRIC GENERATING SYSTEM- WATER TREATMENT PLANT AND WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT

The Authority awarded this contract to APS Contracting Incorporated, in the amount of \$6,641,500.00.

All work has been completed on the solar projects at the WPCP and the WTP.

The new generator at the Main WTP was successfully started up and training was provided. Closeout documentation remains to be submitted. A final change order and estimate will be submitted for approval at the July meeting.

WINDSOR PARK INTERCEPTOR MAIN CLEANING AND LINING

Bids were received on June 5. The contract required bids to be submitted on a reduced scope of work (less footage of main cleaned and televised) and with an alternate bid item for the remainder of the cleaning and lining included in the original scope of work, which the Authority could accept if the budget allows.

Two (2) bids were received and Allstate Power Vac, Incorporated was the low bidder. Their base bid price was \$86,501.00 and their alternate bid price was \$186,504.50, for a total of \$273,005.50. Award is recommended.

WELL NO. 6 REDEVELOPMENT AND PUMP REPLACEMENT

The contract is complete. The final estimate and change orders have been submitted for approval.

WPCP SETTLING TANK REPAIR

Five (5) bids were received on June 5. JP Smith Contractors, Incorporated submitted the low bid in the amount of \$93,900.00. Award is recommended.

SANITARY SEWER TELEVISING

Proposals were received on June 8 from Red Zone Robotics, Incorporated, Veolia Water and Video Pipe Services, Incorporated. The proposals have been reviewed and an evaluation and award recommendation report has been submitted to the Board for review.

GROSS ALPHA INVESTIGATION

Per the Board's direction at the May 2012 meeting, the hydro geological firm of Leggette, Brashears and Graham (LBG) have been hired to conduct an investigation of the gross alpha contamination in Well 5A. As recommended by LBG, a small diameter monitoring well will be drilled at the Well 5A site. Soil and groundwater samples will be retrieved at various depths to determine the source of the gross alpha. Computer modeling of the aquifer will also be conducted to determine the likelihood of contamination throughout the Authority's well field. The best scenario is if the well can be rescreened at a different elevation where gross alpha is not present. Another possible scenario would be to re-drill the well at a different location in the township where no gross alpha contamination is predicted to occur.

- Ms. Jennings asked if there was any opportunity for grants for this type of project.
- Mr. Trice indicated that he was not aware of any.
- Mr. Clemons expressed concern about the disparity in pricing for the Windsor Park Interceptor Cleaning Project. He asked if this would have any effect on the quality of work.

The Consulting Engineer said that the bid specifications were clear and he was familiar with the work of the apparent low bidder Allstate PowerVac.
